

Magic Mirror Art Kit

Supply List	
1 Baroque-style framed mirror	1 HB Pencil
1 set of fairy lights (w/battery)	1 sheet of tracing paper
1 Pen/dual screwdriver	Predrilled wood blocks
3 Design templates (optional)	Silver screws
Picture hanging hardware

Stage 1 – Setting up design

1. Choose your design template, or create your own.
TIP: To create your own, simply sketch it on a blank piece of paper or print it on your home printer.
2. Using tracing paper and HB pencil, trace over design template. Trace over your first trace at least once.

Stage 2 – Preparing mirror

3. Place framed mirror on a flat surface, face down.
4. Using Philips screwdriver bit in pen, carefully removed back screws and set screws aside. You will not be using these.
5. Remove back cover and set aside.
6. Carefully remove mirror and set face down on smooth flat surface such as a table. You can put a paper towel on the table under the mirror, but a thick towel or other soft material is NOT recommended.
7. Place your design over the back of the mirror, with the pencil side down. Tape in place (do not apply too much pressure or you could crack the glass!) Using a smooth side corner of one of the small wood blocks, gently rub across the lines you traced on tracing paper until all lines have been transferred to the back of the mirror.
TIP: Leaving some tape still attached, lift tracing paper to verify that all lines have been transferred to the back of the mirror.
8. In the pen, flip screwdriver bit to the flat head side. Using the corner of the flathead, follow the lines on the back of the mirror that you created with your tracing paper. Gently etch the white paint from the back of the mirror along the lines.
TIP: Take your time with this and use gentle pressure at first, increasing only enough pressure to clear the white paint away and no more. Pressing too hard will crack the glass.
9. Verify that all the etching has been completed by holding mirror side in front of you, with light behind the mirror.

Putting the mirror together

10. Remove packaging materials from fairy lights, pull tab for battery and turn switch to ensure that the lights are working. You may need to use screwdriver for this part.
11. Tape lights to the inside gray part of cardboard mirror backing, carefully avoiding the holes. The switch should be along the bottom edge so that you can easily turn it on and off.
12. Carefully place the mirror back in the frame, ensure that no holes are covered.
13. Place wood blocks at each screw hole, add back cover and use the silver screws to secure in place.
TIP: Make sure you can access the light switch.
14. Add picture hanging hardware to top side wood blocks.

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
